2025 Fireworks Stand Lottery Winners Press Release

Salinas Fire Chief Klemek states, *“Only State approved **“Safe & Sane”** fireworks are allowed to be sold and used in the City of Salinas. The selected non-profit groups will be allowed to start sales beginning June 28, 2025 and ending no later than July 5, 2025”*.

“Dangerous and illegal fireworks such as bottle rockets and M-80s are prohibited throughout California, and persons found using or in possession of dangerous and illegal fireworks are subject to fines ranging from \$1,250 to \$50,000”.

Make sure you and your family celebrate safely during the 4th of July by following these Fireworks Safety Tips:

- Buy and use only “Safe and Sane” fireworks with the State Fire Marshal approved seal.
- Always read and follow instructions on fireworks packaging.
- Always have an adult present and closely supervise children during the use of “Safe and Sane” fireworks.
- Never use fireworks around dry vegetation or areas likely to catch fire.
- After firework has been used, soak in water before discarding.
- Always keep at a safe distance.
 - Always have a garden hose and a bucket of water on hand when using Fireworks.
- If a fire escapes your control, call 911 immediately.
